Kate Colin is designer and maker based in Glasgow who works with folded forms to create bold and colourful lighting, homewares, installations and artworks. Interested in three-dimensional geometric form, she explores how light, colour and geometry interact.

YOU WILL NEED:

Green card or paper (or plain to decorate!),
materials to dress your folded tree

- 1 • Take a piece of paper, cut an exact circle and fold it in half.
- 2 • Take one of the corners and fold inwards and meet the centre edge.
- 3 • Fold back along in the opposite direction to meet vertical edge.
- 4 • Turn the tree over and line up the shorter edge with the longer edge on the opposite side.
- 5 • Time to decorate! could you make your own tinsel out of crushed leaves? or baubles out of berries?
